



## Terms and Conditions



### UKCC1 Coach Assistant

To fulfil the course requirements you must have

- a valid ECB CRB certificate (this process can begin at the course),
- a valid First Aid certificate and
- a valid Safeguarding and Protecting Children certificate from **Sports Coach UK ONLY**. No other Child Protection certificate is accepted.

**You will not have completed the course until ALL of the above certificates have been presented to Coach Ed Admin/Tutors.**

### UKCC2 Coach Award

To fulfil the course requirements you must;

- ◆ give evidence of valid ECB CRB, First Aid and Safeguarding and Protecting Children (Sports Coach UK) certificates.
- ◆ complete the assignments and home study pack that are set each day,
- ◆ complete successfully the supported practice modules (6 x 30 min coaching sessions with a group of children, overseen by a Level 2 Coach)
- ◆ submit your record of coaching (signed by support coach), log book, session plans, risk assessment and evaluations prior to your assessment day,
- ◆ attend an assessment day where you will be asked to coach a group of players, followed by a debrief with an ECB Coach Developer.

**The Assessment Day will be arranged at a later date.**

**Re-assessments will be subject to a fee of approx £50.00**

- You must attend all of the dates stated.
- Payment must be made along with your application in order to secure your place. Places CANNOT be reserved.
- If you cancel your booking less than 2 weeks before the event you will not receive a refund or credit.

#### **Data Protection**
